IMPLEMENTATION OF THE VEHICLE EMERGENCY SIREN POLICY


1. References:

- a. Presidential Directive of PRRD to the PNP during the Emergency Meeting in Malacañang on January 5, 2020 re "anti wang-wang policy";
- b. Memorandum from Special Presidential Assistant (SPA) to SILG dated January 21, 2020; and
- c. Presidential Decree (PD) #96 dated January 13, 1973 of President Ferdinand E Marcos

2. In view of the above references, please be informed that based on existing rules and regulations, it is unlawful for the owner of any motor vehicle to use or attach any siren, bell, horn, whistle or similar gadgets including domelights, blinkers and other similar signaling or flashing devices. This was also reinforced by Republic Act 4136 particularly Sec. 34 thereof which affirms the abovestated provision. It is only the designated government vehicles for official use which are allowed, such as those used by the AFP, PNP, NBI, firetrucks and ambulances.

3. Henceforth, armored vehicles and security agency patrol vehicles (motorcycles included) are banned from utilizing these devices as mentioned above.
